REVELATION: 7 Lampstands = 7 Churches

On May 19, 2010, for the second time in two years, I attended a Seminar on Post Modern Young Adults, and, in particular, what we have to do to reach them as a church. I was disconcerted two years ago, and then again last night as I heard that we can no longer bring them into the church in the way that we have been in the habit of doing—following Scriptural patterns (in my view)—for centuries past.

This prompted me to study the local church: its purpose, its function and its place in the end times as Scripture details. I began with another read-through of the pastoral letters—1 and 2 Timothy and Titus—and what Paul said to these pastors about the church and how it should be overseen; what it should and should not do and what it should and should not tolerate. There does not appear to be one thing that suggests that we sidestep the Scriptural pattern, and I do not find any basis to change the church's purpose, function or place for a particular group of people, however much we want them to come to saving faith—we must not enable their deception.

According to the speaker, Chris Lowry, the following statements in **bold** relate to the characteristics of the post modern young adult (represent my comments):

- 1. Are turned off by criticism of other people's beliefs. (Tolerance over truth. So that any warning or codicils against idolatry, false doctrine, myths and genealogies are off limits.)
- 2. Are genuinely interested in the life and ministry of Jesus. (Who isn't? But they pick the ministries of Jesus that they're interested in to the exclusion of his primary ministry of Redeemer, Savior, Reconciler, because they do not want to see themselves as falling short of God's standards and needing saving.)
- 3. Love things and people who are authentic. (And they would be the judge of that? Even Jesus' authenticity was questioned by the Pharisees, and who was more authentic than Christ?)
- 4. Longs for community.
- 5. Very relationally driven—but likes to control the environment i.e., facebook, myspace, text messaging. (This is all horizontal relating and controlled by them—at their whim. This is not a definition of being authentically relational—no way and no how.)
- 6. Very service oriented. Wants to do mission projects more than talk about them. (This is the most disturbing item in this list. This sounds so clever and even noble, but what is really being said? As believers, we are on mission with God in every area of our 'walk' and 'talk' while <u>living</u> out our faith. God won't send us out there, until we're *missioning* here!)

We must 'be' what God wants us to 'be' before we can authentically 'do' what He wants us to 'do' in the way of missions. When we define the need and go out to meet the need, what have we provided in the way of real need? Mary of Bethany anointed Jesus feet and Judas Iscariot became enraged that the expensive perfume had not been sold and the money given to the poor. Jesus rebuked Judas: "The poor you will always have with you" and he applauded Mary's devotion to Himself. What about 1 Corinthians 13:1-3—we cannot have God's love working through us without a relationship with him.

And what we do without agape' is worthless! What in the world do we have to offer in the way of meeting the world's greatest need, before we know the Lord Jesus Christ as Savior and Lord ourselves? If we want to join the *Peace Corps*, then we should do that, but we should not knowingly send **unbelievers** out to work and love in Jesus' name!)

- 7. Strong sense of social justice.
- 8. Desires mentoring relationships.
- 9. Is drawn toward shared leadership styles more than one person or group making all the decisions. (No surprise here: Rebellion is resistance, defiance and disobedience against authority. This is where we absolutely must go to Paul's pastoral letters and understand God's order of authority in our nation, in our home and in our church.)
- 10.**Interested in church if there is a definite benefit.** (Benefit to whom? I guess the worship of God and the fact that Scripture commands our attendance won't mean anything to unbelievers, but what about to believers? It should mean everything to us.)
- 11. Interested in most religions and their beliefs. (Idolatry has been the primary competitor next to 'self' for the devotion of the true and living God by humans since creation. And it begins with an interest in and a defense of—and quickly moves to a fascination with no-gods.)
- 12. Are drawn to Jesus more out of a sense of making a difference in the world than from fear of going to hell. (Jesus made the greatest difference for the world that has ever been made, and he wants us to carry that message—hence the great commission. We are to go and make disciples, how can one who has not received Jesus Christ as Savior go and make disciples. If they want to go and do good then that is a noble thing, but it is not the great commission that God gave to believers! I pray they are not attempting to make a difference and ignoring and failing to know and share with the lost the greatest difference.)

New Testament Church and Churches

The Apostle Paul wrote 13 of the New Testament's 26 books, and all were addressed to churches or pastors or leaders. In Revelation, Jesus sent letters to seven literal churches. Look at the 79 references to church/churches in the NT:
